

Surveyed for William Aaron, 100 acres of land on a Military Warrant No. 1179 on the waters of Paint Creek. Beginning at three post white oaks in the edge of a prairie, northwest corner to Josiah Cornelius's Survey, northeast corner to Miles Jennings Survey and southeast corner to John Redwood's Survey, running with Redwood's line passing his corner and with the line of Zachariah Jones' Survey, North 160 poles to three hickories in the edge of a prairie, northeast corner to said Jones's Survey, and Southeast corner to John Bowman's Survey; thence East 100 poles crossing the branch to a stake in a prairie; thence South 160 poles to a stake in a prairie, northeast corner to said Cornelius's Survey; thence with his ~~west~~ line West 100 poles to the beginning.



Surveyed for Tunstall Quarles, assignee, 200 acres of land on a Military Warrant No. 1229 on Walnut and Oak Runs, branches of Deer Creek. Beginning at three hickories two from one root, Southwesterly corner to Uriah Springer's Survey No. 1020; thence with his line N. 20 E. 300 poles crossing the trace leading up Deer Creek to Mad River, on the south side of the tract where this line crosses it there is a white oak Marked U.S. crossing Oak Run below where it forms a junction with Walnut Run at 150 poles to two hickories and a white oak, Northwesterly corner to said Springer's Survey; thence N. 70 W. 107 poles to three hickories; thence S. 20 W. 300 poles, crossing Oak Run at 150 poles to two bur oaks; thence S. 70 E. 107 poles, crossing Walnut Run at 10 poles to the beginning.

Beginning at a black oak and white oak, West corner to James Steels Survey No. 3725, running with his line N. 48 E. 160 poles, crossing a branch at 26 poles to two hickories and a black oak; thence N. 42 W. 200 poles to four white oaks; thence S. 48 W. 160 poles crossing a branch at 92 poles to two white oaks and two hickories; thence S. 42 E. 200 poles to the beginning.
