


Surveyed for William Heth, 605 acres of land on part of a Military Warrant No. 2162 on the South fork of Darby's Creek. Beginning at two honey locust and an elm on the bank of the creek on the lower side thereof and in the lower line of John Gibson's Survey No. 2445.; thence with said line S. 53 W. 160 poles to three red elm on the bank of a Branch in said line; thence S. 30 E. 500 poles crossing a branch at 96 poles, a small branch at 69 poles, a branch at 136 poles, one at 260 poles and one at 440 poles to two Dogwoods and three White Oaks, two of them from one root; thence N. 53 E. 160 poles to a buckeye, Cherry tree, two Elms and three Honey Locusts on the bank of the Creek; thence N. 10 E. 30 poles, crossing the Creek; thence up the creek on the upper side thereof with the meanders thereof and binding thereon, N. 20 E. 22 poles, North 48 poles, N. 52 W. 20 poles, S. 80 W. 50 poles to two Black Walnuts and a Honey Lucust, upper corner on the Creek to Thomas Thweatt's

Survey No. 2661; thence with Thweatt's upper line, N. 20 E. 112 poles to two white oaks and two small Ashes in said line and in the back line of Oliver Towle's Survey No. 2676; thence with Towle's line N. 37 W. 308 poles crossing a small branch at 53, one at 64, at 88, crossing a pond from 192 to 219 poles, passing the head of a spring at 273 poles to a Red Elm and White Oak in the lower line of Gibson's Said Survey; thence with the said line S. 53 W. 30 poles, crossing the Creek and an Island, to the beginning.



Surveyed for Archibald Finley 100 acres of land on a Military Warrant No. 982 on the waters of Paint Creek. Beginning at two hickories and a Black oak, 140 poles South from the Southwest corner of James Galloway jr's. Survey No. 6204, running East 32 poles to two bur oaks; thence South 160 poles to three hickories; thence West 100 poles to two Hickories and a Black Oak; thence North 160 poles to a stake in a Prairie; thence East 68 poles to the beginning.

Surveyed for James Rice, 200 acres of land on a Military Warrant No. 3089 on the waters of Darby's Creek. Beginning at two white oaks and an Ash, upper back corner to John Crawford's Survey No. 2680, in the line of Joseph B. Lapsley's Survey No. 6643, running with Crawford's line, S. 37 E. 100 poles to a white oak and Hickory; thence S. 53 W. 320 poles to two White Oaks; thence N. 37 W. 100 poles to a stake; thence N. 53 E. 320 poles passing Lapsley's Southerly corner and with his line to the beginning.
