


Surveyed for Robert Means, assignee, 150 acres of land on part of a Military Warrant No. 5105 on the waters of Darby's Creek. Beginning at three Dogwoods from one root and an Elm 60 poles East of a Well sunk by Obijah Cary on the West side of a road from North Liberty by Dyers Mill to Chillicothe at which Well said Cary now lives, running South 110 poles to three Hickories and a White Oak; thence West 150 poles to three Elms; thence North 160 poles to two Hickories and a Black Oak; thence East 150 poles to two Black Oaks and an Elm; thence South 150 poles to the beginning.



Surveyed for Henry Flesher, assignee, 200 acres of land on a Military Warrant No. 5113 on Lubbergut, a west branch of Opossum run a branch of Deer Creek. Beginning at a bur oak, Black Oak, Jack Oak and Hickory the Black Oak marked H.F. N. 80 E. 492 poles or thereabouts from the Southeasterly corner of Baron Steuben's Survey No. 2698; thence N. 52 E. 220 poles crossing a branch at 135 poles and one at 164 poles to a hickory and Black Oak; thence S. 38 E. 146 poles to eight hickories; thence S. 52 W. 220 poles crossing a branch at 15 poles, crossing Lubbergut at 35 poles to a Jack Oak and Elm; thence N. 38 W. 146 poles to the beginning.

Surveyed for James Low, 200 acres of land on a Military Warrant No. 1124 on the waters of Darby's Creek. Beginning at a large Elm marked I.T. on the South side of a branch which empties into Darby's Creek on the West side about two miles below the mouth of Treacles Creek, and about one miles and a half up said branch above the mouth running S. 34 W. 80 poles to a large white oak, Elm and Red Oak; thence N. 56 W. 200 poles to two White Oaks; thence N. 34 E. 160 poles crossing a branch at 20, and one at 128 poles to a Bur Oak, Black Oak and Hickory; thence S. 56 E. 200 poles to three Bur Oaks; thence S. 34 W. 80 poles to the beginning.
