




Surveyed for David Bradford, assignee 300 acres of land on part of a Military Warrant No. 3578, on Duns run a branch of Darby's Creek. Beginning at two Black Oaks and a Bur Oak, East corner to William Bond's Survey No. 5294, N. 34 E. about 75 poles from a point where the upper line of James Low's Survey No. 5193 crosses said run; thence N. 34 E. 10 poles to a white oak; thence N.  $33\frac{1}{2}$  W. 367 poles crossing a road to two Hickories and two Elms; thence N.  $56\frac{1}{2}$  W. 160 poles crossing Duns run at 80 poles to two Black Oaks; thence S.  $33\frac{1}{2}$  E. 302 poles crossing the road at 76 poles to a stake in the upper line of Bond's said Survey; thence with said line N. 34 E. 112 poles crossing the run at 80 poles to two White Oaks, North corner to Bond's said Survey; thence with another line thereof, S. 56 E. 120 poles to the beginning.



Surveyed for William Bond, assignee, 150 acres of land on part of a Military Warrant No. 5096 on the waters of Darby's Creek. Beginning at two White Oaks, Westerly corner to James Low's Survey No. 5193, running with his line and course thereof N. 34 E. 200 poles crossing a branch at 20 and one at 128 poles to two Black Oaks and a Bur Oak; thence N. 56 W. 120 poles to two White Oaks; thence S. 34 W. 200 poles crossing a branch to three White Oaks; thence S. 56 E. 120 poles to the beginning.

Surveyed for Peter Muhlenberg, 650 acres of land on part of a Military Warrant No. 176 on the waters of Deer Creek. Beginning at a White Oak, Westerly corner to Robert Sharp's Survey No. 5897; thence South 292 poles to two Black Oaks and a Hickory in the line of the Representatives of Peter Halphinstine's Survey No. 4513; thence S.  $81^{\circ} 20'$  W. 222 poles to two Hickories and a White Oak in said line Southeasterly corner to George Hoffman's Survey No. 8743; thence North 290 poles to a stake, Northeast corner to said Survey; thence West 85 poles to two Hickories, East corner to said Halphinstine's Survey No. 4515; thence N. 40 W. 85 poles to a stake in the line of said Survey; thence N. 46 E. 238 poles to a Stake in the line of Joseph Harness' Survey No. 8864; thence with said line S. 44 E. 260 poles crossing Oak run at 74 poles and at 116 poles to the beginning.
