



thence N. 53 E. 430 poles to two white oaks and a hickory; thence S. 11 E. 360 poles to
two hickories; thence S. 53 W. 365 poles to the beginning.

northeast corner to Abraham Mauray's
Survey No. 1344 northwest corner to
Patrick Carnes Survey No. 1256 and south-
west corner to an entry made for Charles
Fleming No. 1265, running North 400 poles
to a stake in a prairie; thence West 400
poles to two small black walnuts and two
honey locusts in the edge of a small
prairie; thence South 400 poles, passing
the northeast corner of Clement Reads Survey No. 1293 at 44 poles to two white oaks and
two black oaks in Reads line and northwest corner to Abraham Mauray's Survey; thence with
Mauray's line East 400 poles to the beginning.
