


N. 87 W. 200 poles to three Hickories; thence S. 3 E. 112 poles crossing a branch to a White Oak; thence S. 87 E. 200 poles crossing a branch at 86 poles to two Hickories and a White Oak, Northwesterly corner to said Worthington's Survey No. 4564; thence with his line S. 3 E. 140 poles crossing a branch at 20 poles to a White Oak, Southwesterly corner to said Survey; thence with another line of the said Survey, N. 87 E. 160 poles to a Black Oak and Hickory, Southeasterly corner to said Survey and corner to said Worthington's Survey No. 6499; thence with the line of the last mentioned Survey, S. 56 E. 84 poles to a Black Oak corner to said Survey; thence with another line N. 87 E. 194 poles to a White Oak, another corner of said Survey; thence N. 50 E. 32 poles to the beginning.

Surveyed for John Stokes 310 acres of land on part of a Military Warrant No. 1396, on the East fork of Paint Creek. Beginning in the upper line of Thomas Hoff's Survey No. 3789, where the same crosses the East fork of Paint Creek, running with the said line, N. 70 E. 129 poles passing Hoff's corner at 100 poles to a large bur oak; thence N. 39 E. 25 poles to two White Oaks; thence N. 5 E. 60 poles to three Bur Oaks; thence N. 27 W. 64 poles to two Bur Oaks; thence N. 49 W. 42 poles to two White Oaks; thence N. 23 W. 32 poles to a White Oak; thence N. 5 E. 43 poles to a White Oak; thence N. 64 W. 57 poles to two White Oaks; thence N. 17 W. 30 poles to three White Oaks in the line of Samuel Smith's Survey No. 4156; thence with his line S. 64 W. 172 poles crossing the East fork at 129 poles to a Hickory and dead Bur Oak, in said Smith's line; thence S. 17 E. 25 poles to a Stake in a Prairie; thence S. 64 E. 26 poles to two Black Oaks; thence S. 5 W. 25 poles to a Bur Oak and Hickory; thence S. 23 E. 79 poles to a stake in a Prairie; thence S. 49 E. 56 poles to two Black Oaks; thence S. 27 E. 37 poles to a Black Oak; thence S. 5 W. 45 poles to a White Oak; thence S. 39 W. 28 poles to a Hickory in the line of said Hoff's Survey; thence N. 70 E. 43 poles to the beginning.
