


thence North 16 poles to a Bur Oak; thence West 60 poles to three Bur Oaks; thence South 58 poles to two Bur Oaks; thence W. 116 poles to two Hickories; thence North 36 poles to two Bur Oaks and a Black Oak; thence West 84 poles to two Hickories and Black Oak; thence North 66 poles to two Hickories; thence West 130 poles to two Black Oaks; thence South 230 poles to a Stake in the line of Charles A. Stuart's Survey No. 5546; thence with his line East 17 poles to a Stake (a Jack Oak bearing S. 17 E. 6 poles distant) North-easterly corner to Stuart's said Survey; thence with the line of said Stuarts Survey and the line of Langham and Puthuff's Survey No. 6252, South 280 poles to a Stake, South-easterly corner to Langham and Puthuff's said Survey; thence East 640 poles to two Black Oaks; thence North 63 poles to two White Oaks; thence N. 55 W. 136 poles to three Bur Oaks; thence N. 25 W. 34 poles to two Bur Oaks, one of them forked in the line of Shearer's said Survey; thence with his line West 50 poles to the beginning.
