



Stuart's Survey No. 5546, running North 240 poles to three Bur Oaks; thence East 133-1/3 poles to three Bur Oaks from one root; thence South 240 poles to a Stake in Stuart's line; thence with his line West 133-1/3 poles to the beginning.

Surveyed for Samuel Smith, 1080 acres of land on part of a Military Warrant No. 4988 on the waters of Paint Creek. Beginning at two White Oaks and Two Hickories, running S. 20 E. 210 poles to a White Oak; thence S. 70 W. 54 poles to a Hickory; thence S. 20 E. 270 poles to two White Oaks one of them forked; thence S. 70 W. 34 poles to a Hickory and Elm; thence S. 20 E. 110 poles to a Black Oak; thence S. 70 W. 192 poles to a forked White Oak; thence N. 20 W. 55 poles

to a Black Oak and White Oak; thence N. 70 E. 65 poles to a White Oak; thence N. 20 W. 426 poles to a White Oak; thence S. 70 W. 265 poles to a Stake in a Prairie, thin timbered land; thence S. 20 E. 266 poles to the Northeast corner of Elias Langham's entry of 190 acres; thence S. 64 W. 180 poles to three Hickories in an old line; thence with said line North 426 poles to a Stake; thence N. 70 E. 504 poles to the beginning.
