


Surveyed for Joel Stokes, assee. 400 acres of land on a Military Warrant No. 4928 on a branch of Deer Creek. Beginning at two White Oaks and an Elm, South corner to Joseph Swearingen's Survey No. 4200, running with his line N. 42 W. 106 poles crossing the branch at 6 poles to three Elms; thence S. 48 W. 320 poles to three Hickories and a Black Oak; thence S. 42 E. 200 poles to a Red Oak, Black Oak and Hickory; thence N. 48 E. 320 poles crossing several branches to two White Oaks and a Black Oak; thence N. 42 W. 94 poles to the beginning.

Surveyed for the Representatives of Peter Helphenstine 1158 acres of land on part of a Military Warrant No. 5036 on Walnut Run a branch of Deer Creek. Beginning at an Elm and double Hickory, Southwest corner to said Helphinstine's former Survey No. 4387 of 800 acres; thence with a line of the said Survey, North 396 poles crossing Walnut Run to two Bur Oaks, Northwest corner to said Survey; thence West 473 poles to two large White Oaks; thence South 396 poles crossing the run at 316 poles to a Hickory and Bur Oak; thence East 473 poles to the beginning.

Surveyed for William Reynolds, assee, 140 acres of land on part of a Military Warrant No. 4376, on the waters of Deer Creek. Beginning at a Honey Locust and three Elms, on the North side of a branch Easterly corner to Claiborne Maddox's Survey No. 3727, running S. 42 E. 140 poles, crossing the branch at the beginning to two White Oaks and a Hickory; thence S. 48 W. 160 poles to two Hickories; thence N. 42 W. 140 poles to a White Oak and Hickory; South corner to said Maddox's Survey; thence with his line N. 48 E. 160 poles, crossing the branch three times, to the beginning.
