


Surveyed for the Representatives of Peter Helphinstine's, 800 acres of land on part of a Military Warrant No. 5036, on Walnut Run, a branch of Deer Creek. Beginning at three Hickories about a mile and a half above where the trace leading up Deer Creek to Mad River crosses said run; thence West 272 poles to an Elm and double Hickory; thence North 396 poles crossing the run to two Bur Oaks; thence East 332 poles to five Bur Oaks and a large Elm; thence South 254 poles, crossing the run at 197 poles to two Black Oaks; thence S. 23 W. 152 poles to the beginning.



Surveyed for Robert Means, assee. 450 acres of land on three Military Warrants Nos. 4930, 5000 and 5018 on the waters of Deer Creek. Beginning at a white Oak and Hickory, South corner to Claiborne Maddox's Survey No. 3727 and East corner to Joseph Swearingen's Survey No. 4200, running with Swearingen's line S. 48 W. 321 poles, crossing several small drains to two White Oaks and an Elm, South corner to said Swearingen's Survey; thence S. 42 E. 309 poles to a White Oak and Hickory; thence N. 20 E. 363 poles to two Hickories; South corner to William Reynold's Survey No. 4423; thence with his line N. 42 W. 140 poles to the beginning.

Beginning at two Hickories, South corner to James Steel's Survey No. 3725, running S. 42 E. 200 poles to three Black Oaks; thence N. 48 E. 160 poles to two White Oaks; thence N. 42 W. 200 poles to a Hickory and White Oak; in the line of said Steele's Survey; thence with said line S. 48 W. 160 poles to the beginning.
