


Surveyed for Charles Simms 800 acres of land on part of a Military Warrant No. 351, on the upper side of Darby's Creek. Beginning at a buck-eye and a black walnut, upper corner on the creek to William Brown's Survey No. 1478, running up the creek with the meanders thereof, N. 10 E. 56, N. 10 W. 28, N. 30 W. 68, N. 30 E. 56, S. 77 E. 34, N. 77 E. 46, S. 10 E. 16, N. 80 E. 10, N. 35 E. 30, North 30, N. 25 W. 75, N. 65 W. 38, North 80 poles to a lynn and black oak; thence N. 53 E.

320 poles to two sugar trees; thence S. 37 E. 295 poles to two sugar trees; thence S. 53 W. 590 poles, passing the upper back corner of said Brown's Survey, and with his line to the beginning.



Surveyed for Thomas Sheldon, Assignee, 666-2/3 acres of land on part of a Military Warrant No. 2014, on the waters of Paint Creek. Beginning at two red oaks and two hickories in the line of Andrew Dunscomb's Survey No. 3674, and northeast corner to William S. Smith's Survey No. 1362; thence with Smiths line West 400 poles crossing Paint Creek at 96 poles to a black ash, elm and white oak; thence North 267 poles to an elm near a pond; thence East 400 poles, crossing the creek at 346 poles to a cherry tree, red oak, elm and hickory; thence South 267 poles to the beginning.

Surveyed for Nathaniel Terry, 1000 acres of land on part of a Military Warrant No. 2601, on the waters of Paint Creek. Beginning at an ash, elm and white oak, northwest corner to William S. Smith's Survey No. 1362, running South 400 poles to a cherry tree, two post white oaks and an elm, southwest corner to said Smith northwest corner to Samuel K. Bradford's Survey No. 1310, and northeast corner to William Eustace's Survey No. 3649; thence West 400 poles crossing a branch at 60 poles to a stake in a prairie, northwest corner to Eustace and northeast corner to Thomas Pemberton's Survey No. 1133; thence North 400 poles to two hickories and a white oak; thence East 400 poles crossing the branch to the beginning.
