




Surveyed for Gabriel Peterson, assee. 100 acres of land on part of a Military Warrant No. 226 on the waters of Darby's Creek. Beginning at a bur oak and two Hickories, 240 poles S.  $62\frac{1}{2}$  W. from the Northwesterly corner of Lucas Sullivant's Survey No. 3240, running N. 81 W. 200 poles to three Jack Oaks; thence S. 9 W. 80 poles crossing a branch at 40 poles to a Stake in a Prairie; thence S. 81 E. 200 poles to three Bur Oaks; thence N. 9 E. 80 poles crossing a branch at 60 poles to the beginning.



Surveyed for Duncan McArthur, assee. 130 acres of land on part of a Military Warrant No. 5072 on the South side of the South fork of Darby's Creek. Beginning at three Sycamores, upper corner on the creek to Peyton Powell's Survey No. 2451; thence with his upper line, S. 14 W. 126 poles to a Black Oak and two White Oaks from one root; thence S. 85 W. 162 poles, crossing a branch to a White Oak and a Hickory; thence N. 75 W. 22 poles to two White Oaks and a Hickory; thence N. 20 W. 66 poles to an Ash and five Lynns from one root, on the bank of the creek; thence down the Creek with the meanders thereof, N. 80 E. 46, N. 25 E. 54, S. 85 E. 32, S. 72 E. 35, N. 53 E. 20, N. 24 E. 66, S. 70 E. 20, S. 40 E. 34 poles to the beginning.

Surveyed for Obediah Smith  $466\frac{2}{3}$  acres of land on part of a Military Warrant No. 685 on Little Darby's Creek. Beginning at a Red Oak and Bur Oak, running N. 6 E. 260 poles crossing the creek at 80 poles, passing the Southeast corner of William Heth's Survey No. 4946 at 20, with his line passing his Northeast corner 180 poles to a Stake; thence S. 84 E. 250 poles to three Ashes two from one root; thence S. 6 W. 345 poles, crossing the creek at 325 poles to two Hickories and a Bur Oak; thence N. 67 W. 260 poles crossing a branch at 20 poles to the beginning.
