

Beginning at two White Oaks at the mouth of the first branch below Lucas Sullivant Survey No. 3313, running down the creek with the meanders thereof, S. 28 E. 16, S. 47 E. 32, S. 79 E. 24, South 40, S. 38 E. 10, S. 18 W. 66, S. 2 E. 8, S. 12 W. 16 poles to two White Oaks; thence N. 80 W. 82 poles to three Bur Oaks; thence N. 47 W. 66 poles to a Bur Oak and Hickory; thence N. 20 E. 88 poles to two Walnuts and an Elm; thence N. 61 E. 62 poles to the beginning.



Surveyed for Robert Means, assee, 100 acres of land on a Military Warrant No. 5119 on the waters of Treacles Creek. Beginning at a Stake in a Prairie 20 poles S. 25 E. from a Spring on a Glade near the mouth of the Spring fork of said creek, running N. 65 E. 30 poles to a Stake in a Prairie; thence N. 25 W. 178 poles to three White Oaks; thence S. 65 W. 90 poles to two White Oaks; thence S. 25 E. 178 poles to a Stake in a Prairie; thence N. 65 E. 60 poles to the beginning.



Beginning at two Hickories Easterly corner to Terence Doran's Survey No. 5143, running with his line S. 53 W. 160 poles to two Sugar Trees Southerly corner to said Doren's Survey in the line of Robert Means' Survey No. 3743; thence with his line passing his corner S. 37 E. 200 poles to a Sugar tree; Ash and Mulberry; thence N. 53 E. 160 poles to three Ashes and a Lynn; thence N. 37 W. 200 poles to the beginning.

Beginning at three Bur Oaks and a Hickory, Southeast corner to said McKee's Survey No. 5218, running with said line West 160 poles to a Black Oak and four Bur Oaks; thence South 200 poles to a large White Oak and two small White Oaks; thence E. 160 poles to a forked White Oak and Black Oak; thence North 200 poles to the beginning.
