


Surveyed for Robert Means, assee, 830 acres of land on part of 3 Military Warrants No. 5105 for 750 acres, 30 acres on No. 5106 and 50 acres on 5109 on the East branch of Deer Creek, called the Big glade. Beginning at a forked Elm and forked White Oak, Northerly corner to the Representatives of Mathew Arbuckle, dec'd Survey No. 3900 and corner to John Beck's Survey No. 4125, running with Beck's line N. 41 W. 352 poles to a Stake Northerly corner to said Beck's Survey; thence S. 47 W. 48 poles to a Black Oak; thence N. 20 W. 215 poles to two White Oaks; thence N. 51 E. 200 poles, crossing the branch at 130 poles to two Black Oaks; thence S. 37 E. 898 poles crossing several small branches to a Stake in the line of the Representatives of said Arbuckle decd. Survey; thence with said line N. 67 W. 398 poles crossing the branch and a glade to the beginning.

Surveyed for Robert Means, assee, 400 acres of land on three Military Warrants No. 5115, 5116 and 5117 on the Spring fork of Treacles creek. Beginning at a Stake in a Prairie on the North bank of the creek in the upper line of William B. Wallace's entry No. 5064, where it crosses said creek, running with his line and course thereof N. 50 E. 110 poles to three White Oaks; thence N. 17 W. 193 poles to a Red Oak and Bur Oak; thence N. 22 W. 82 poles to two Hickories and a White Oak; thence N. 75 W. 150 poles to a Bur Oak and Black Oak; thence S. 40 W. 122 poles crossing the Creek at 80 poles to three White Oaks; thence S. 75 E. 120 poles to two White Oaks and a Hickory; thence S. 10 W. 218 poles to a White Oak and Hickory; thence S. 46 E. 120 poles to three White Oaks; thence N. 50 E. 90

poles, passing Wallace's corner and with his line to the beginning.
