Surveyed for John Peyton 1000 acres of land on part of a Military Warrant No. 56 on the waters of Paint Creek. Beginning at two black ashes, and two black oaks in the line of Samuel K. Bradford's Survey No. 1310 and northwest corner to Francis Cowherd's Survey No. 713, running with Cowherd's line, East 355 poles to a hickory and a forked black oak, northeast corner to said Cowherd's Survey and in the line of James Galt's Survey No. 1387; thence with Galt's line and course thereof North 451 poles to three elms and a black ash; thence West 355 poles to a red oak, red bud, white oak, hickory and black ash; thence South with the line of William S. Smith Survey No. 1362, 451 poles to the beginning.

Surveyed for Clement Read, eldest son and heir at law to Col. Isaac Read, dec'd, 1333 acres of land on part of a Military Warrant No. 46 on the waters of Paint Creek. Beginning at three elms and a walnut, northeast corner to Everard Meads Survey No. 1272, running with Meads line, West 400 poles to two elms and a hickory, northwest corner to Mead; thence North 534 poles to two hickories and a black oak; thence East 400 poles to four white oaks; thence South 534 poles to the beginning.
