


Surveyed for Robert Means, assee, 200 acres of land on part of a Military Warrant No. 5125 on Treacles creek. Beginning at a forked White Oak, North corner to Bailey and Stanton's Survey No. 4735, running with their line S. 45 E. 180 poles, crossing the creek at 100 poles to two White Oaks in said line; thence N. 45 E. 180 poles to a Stake in a Prairie; thence N. 45 W. 180 poles to two Hickories and a Bur Oak in the edge of a Prairie; thence S. 45 W. 180 poles crossing the creek to the beginning.



Surveyed for William Creighton, junr. assee, 237 acres of land on part of a Military Warrant No. 5138 on the waters of the North fork of Paint Creek. Beginning one hundred poles South of a White Oak on a rise about five poles South of a small branch, the tree is marked X.Y.Z. running West 100 poles to seven White Oaks; thence North 190 poles to a Stake; thence East 200 poles to a Stake in a Prairie, a Bur Oak twelve poles distance bearing N. 82 E.; thence South 190 poles to two Bur Oaks; thence West 100 poles to the beginning.

Surveyed for the Representative of William Case, 200 acres of land on a Military Warrant No. 5189 on the Spring fork of Treacles Creek. Beginning at three White Oaks Westerly corner to Robert Means Survey No. 5281, running with his line and course thereof, N. 40 E. 180 poles, crossing the creek at 72 poles to a Black Oak, White Oak and Red Oak; thence N. 10 E. 170 poles to three White Oaks; thence S. 84 W. 200 poles crossing the creek at 108 poles to a Stake; thence S. 9 E. 284 poles to the beginning.
