

Surveyed for Duncan McArthur, assee, 1200 acres of land on part of a Military Warrant No. 5131 on Glady Run a Northeast branch of Deer creek which is the largest branch that runs through David Bradford's Survey No. 3973. Beginning at two White Oaks, Northeasterly corner to Robert Means Survey No. 5046; thence with the upper line of said Survey, S. 64 W. 140 poles crossing Glady run at 38 poles to two Elms, Easterly corner to Stephen Southall's Survey No. 553; thence with Southall's line N. 65 W. 170 poles to two Black Oaks and two White Oaks; thence N. 20 W. 380 poles to three Red Oaks and an Elm; thence N. 45 E. 78 poles to three Red Oaks in the edge of the plains; thence N. 62 E. 345 poles crossing Glady run at 234 poles to two White Oaks and a Black Oak; thence S. 40 E. 174 poles to three Black Oaks; thence South 143 poles to a Hickory, Elm and a large White Oak; thence S. 12 W. 320 poles to the beginning.



Surveyed for Alexander and James Dunlap, assee. 140 acres of land on part of two Military Warrants, Alexander 40 acres on No. 1642 and James 100 acres on No. 3754, on the South branch of Bradford's fork of Deer Creek. Beginning at two Hickories and a White Oak, Northwest corner to Thomas Worthington's Survey No. 4564, and corner to his Survey No. 6824 of 1978-1/3 acres; thence with his line N. 87 W. 200 poles crossing the branch to a White Oak another of Worthington's corners; thence with another of his lines, N. 3 W. 113 poles crossing the branch to three Hickories, corner to Worthington's said Survey; thence with another of his lines S. 87 E. 200 poles to a stake corner to the said Survey; thence S. 3 E. 113 poles to the beginning.

Surveyed for John Shearer, assee, 200 acres of land on part of two Military Warrants, 70 acres on No. 5164 and 130 acres on No. 5332, on the waters of Paint or Deer Creek. Beginning at two Hickories 60 poles South of a forked White Oak marked "T.Q." running North 60 poles to the forked White Oak and Bur Oak; thence N. 60 W. 100 poles to two Bur Oaks; thence North 100 poles to two Bur Oaks and a Hickory; thence East 190 poles to a Stake in a Prairie; thence South 200 poles to a Stake in a prairie; thence West 110 poles to the beginning.
