



Beginning at a Jack Oak, a Plum thicket, North-east corner to said McKee's Survey No. 5220; thence with his line West 34 poles to a Stake in a prairie in said line; thence North 40 poles to a Stake in a Prairie; thence East 194 poles to a Stake in a prairie; thence North 38 poles to a stake in a prairie; thence East 40 poles to a stake in a field; thence North 10 poles to a stake in a field; thence East 40 poles to a dead Hickory; thence South 148 poles to two Bur Oaks; thence West 240 poles to a Stake in a prairie in the line of said Survey; thence with said line North 60 poles to the beginning.



Surveyed for Daniel Countz, assee. and William McKee 175-2/3 acres of land on part of two Military Warrants, Countz 116-2/3 acres on No. 5229 and McKee 59 acres on No. 5131, on the waters of the North fork of Paint Creek. Beginning at a Hickory and dead Bur Oak Southeasterly corner to Richard C. Bacon's Survey No. 8505, in the line of Samuel Smith's Survey No. 4156; thence S. 20 E.

180 poles to a Hickory and White Oak in said line; thence West 216 poles to a Stake; S. 43 E. 7 links from a Bur Oak; thence N. 20 W. 107 poles to two Small Sassafras, in the line of Bryder & Hart's Survey No. 8505; thence with said line and the line of Bacon's said Survey, N. 70 E. 204 poles to the beginning.

Surveyed for Robert Means, assee. 222 acres of land on part of a Military Warrant No. 5169, on the waters of Paint Creek. Beginning at two Black Oaks, in the West line of Robert Jones' Survey No. 1341, 95 poles from the Southwest corner thereof, and from the Northwest corner of Thomas Shelton's Survey No. 1238, running with said line and course thereof North 225 poles crossing several small branches to an Elm and Ash; thence West 45 poles to two Hickories; thence South 37 poles to a three forked Black Oak; thence West 184 poles crossing a prairie and branch to a Stake; thence S. 24 E. 204 poles to three Hickories; thence East 145 poles crossing the prairie and branch at 35 poles to the beginning.
