


Surveyed for James Morton, 814-1/2 acres of land on two Military Warrants, 444 1/2 acres No. 4789 and 370 acres on No. 5345, on the waters of Paint Creek and the Little Miami. Beginning at an Elm, Southwest corner to William Tompkin's Survey No. 1450 thence West 320 poles to two Ashes, An Elm and Hickory, corner to Harrod and Hill's Survey No. 5149; thence with their line South 110 poles to a Hickory, Elm and Mulberry, Southeast corner to said Survey; thence with another of their lines, West 80 poles to two Maples, a Bur Oak and Elm, in the line of George Munroe's Survey No. 1446, Southwest corner to Harrod and Hill's said Survey; thence with Munroe's line South 200 poles, to three Maples; thence East 320 poles to an Elm and Hickory; thence South 36 poles to a Maple and two Elms; thence East 80 poles to two Elms, a Bur Oak and Ash; thence North 303 poles to a Bur Oak and Black Oak; thence East 40 poles to a Bur Oak and two Elms, in the line of Clement Roads Survey No. 1293; thence with said line, North 310 poles to a Black Oak and two Hickories, Northwest corner to said Survey; thence West 40 poles to two Elms and a Black Jack, Northeast corner to Tompkins; thence with his line South 267 poles to the beginning.



Surveyed for Thomas Scott, assee, 461 acres of land on two Military Warrants No. 5290 and 5375, on the waters of Deer creek. Beginning at two White Oaks and two Black Oaks, one of the White Oaks and one of the Black Oaks having fallen down, North corner to Joseph Swearingen's Survey No. 4200, and East corner to Thomas M. Bayly's Survey No. 5998, running with Bayly's line, N. 42 W. 245.9 poles, crossing a branch at 16 poles to a Black Oak and two Beeches in Bayly's line; thence N. 48 E. 300 poles to two Beeches in the plains in the line of the heirs of Butler Clairborne's Survey No. 6014; thence with their line S. 42 E. 245.9 poles to a White Oak, Black Oak and an Ash, corner to their Survey in the line of Peter Leonberger's Survey No. 3762; thence with his line, S. 48 W. 300 poles crossing a branch at 30 poles to the beginning.

Surveyed for William McKee, 175 acres of land on part of a Military Warrant No. 5131 on the waters of Paint Creek. Beginning 80 poles East of two White Oaks on the west side of a prairie one marked I.D. one M.M., running West 160 poles to a Black Oak and four Bur Oaks; thence North 100 poles to two Post Oaks; thence East 40 poles to two Post Oaks and a Black Oak; thence North 100 poles to seven Bur Oaks; thence East 120 poles to a stake; thence South 200 poles to the beginning.
