


Surveyed for James Galloway, Jur. assee, 100 acres of land on part of a Military Warrant No. 5393 on the lower side of Treacles creek. Beginning at three White Oaks and an Elm, West-erly corner to Jacob Woolston's Survey No. 2836, running with his line S. ~~75~~ E. 48 poles to two White Oaks; thence S. 53 W. 70 poles to three White Oaks; thence S. 85 W. 68 poles to two White Oaks from one root; thence N. 60 W. 62 poles to a Black Oak and White Oaks; thence S. 82 W. 82 poles to two White Oaks from one root; thence N. 40 E. 96 poles to two Elms at the mouth of a small branch on Treacles Creek; thence down the same with the meanders thereof, S. 55 E. 6, N. 84 E. 20, S. 85 E. 34, N. 48 E. 27, N. 72 E. 28, S. 47 E. 36, N. 72 E. 20, S. 84 E. 28 poles to an Elm in the line of said Woolston's Survey; thence with his line S. 53 E. 18 poles to the beginning.



Surveyed for James Galloway, Jur. assee, 335 acres of land on part of a Military Warrant No. 5516 on the waters of Paint creek. Beginning at a Black Oak and Hickory, Northwest corner to Charles A. Stuart's Survey No. 5546, running West 198 poles to a Black Oak; thence South 270 poles to three White Oaks; thence East 198 poles to a Black Oak and White Oak; thence North 270 poles crossing a small branch at 20 poles, passing said Stuart's Southwest corner and with his line to the beginning.



Surveyed for Tuttle Hudson, devisee &c of William Hudson, decd. 100 acres of land on part of a Military Warrant No. 5264 on the waters of Treacles creek. Beginning at a White Oak, Dogwood and an Ash, upper back corner to James Galloway Jur's. Survey No. 5743, running N. 6 E. 60 poles to three Elms; thence S. 84 E. 70 poles to two Elms; thence S. 6 W. 68 poles to an Elm and Bur Oak; thence S. 84 E. 44 poles to two Black Oaks and a Hickory; thence S. 8 E. 264 poles to a Stake in the back line of said Galloway's Survey; thence with said line N. 28 W. 328 poles to the beginning.

Surveyed for George Hoffman, assee, 104 acres of land on part of a Military Warrant No. 5534, on the waters of Deer creek. Beginning at a Hickory and Bur Oak, Northwest corner to Sigismond Stribling's Entry No. 5802, running North 167 poles to a Stake in a prairie; thence West 160 poles to a Hickory and White Oak; thence South 59 poles to a Stake in the line of said Hoffman's Entry No. 6246; thence with said line East 92 poles to a White Oak; thence South 108 poles to two Black Oaks and four White Oaks; thence East 68 poles to the beginning.
