


Surveyed for James Galloway, junr. assee, 200 acres of land on a Military Warrant No. 1429 on Little Darby's creek. Beginning at a Stake lower corner on the creek to Simon Stockdale's Survey No. 4808, running with his line, passing his corner N. 6 E. 190 poles to a White Oak, Dogwood and an Ash; thence S. 28 E. 450 poles to four Elms; thence S. 78 W. 170 poles to three Honey Locust on the bank of the creek; thence up the creek with the meanders thereof binding thereon N. 4 W. 154, N. 85 E. 24, N. 35 E. 24, N. 58 W. 36, North 36, N. 60 W. 54, S. 66 W. 34 poles to the beginning.


Three Mile Run a branch of Darbys creek. Beginning at a Black Oak and Black Walnut, 986 poles N. 47 $\frac{1}{2}$ E. from the mouth of the

Spring fork of Treacles creek, running East 150 poles to an Ash, Elm and Hickory; thence South 86 poles to three Elms on a drain; thence S. 62 E. 84 poles to an Elm and Burr Oak; thence East 150 poles to three White Oaks; thence North 160 poles crossing the branch at 96 poles to an

Elm, Bur Oak and Black Oak; thence N. 75 W. 232 poles to a Stake; thence West 150 poles to a Black Oak and Bur Oak; thence South 98 poles, crossing the branch at 50 poles to the beginning.

Surveyed for James Galloway, junr. assee, 340 acres of land on three Military Warrants No. 5279, 5280 and 40 acres part of 5282, on the Spring fork of Treacles creek. Beginning at two White Oaks Southerly corner to William B. Wallace's Survey No. 5064, running East 116 poles to a Bur Oak; thence S. 18 E. 150 poles to three White Oaks; thence S. 68 W. 70 poles to two White Oaks; thence S. 18 E. 94 poles crossing a branch at 86 poles to a Black Walnut; thence N. 68 E. 80 poles to two White Oaks, one of them forked; thence S. 25 E. 30 poles to two White Oaks, North westerly corner to Robert Means' Survey No. 5148; thence with his line and course thereof N. 65 E. 152 poles to a Stake; thence with the line of John Baird's Survey No. 5263, N. 20 W. 150 poles crossing the creek at 68 poles to two White Oaks in said Baird's line; thence S. 80 W. 60 poles to two Hickories and an Elm; thence N. 18 W. 100 poles to two White Oaks; thence N. 68 E. 30 poles to two Bur Oaks; thence N. 50 W. 100 poles to two White Oaks; thence West 118 poles to two Black Oaks corner to said Wallace's Survey; thence with his line S. 20 W. 120 poles crossing the creek at 60 poles to the beginning.
