Surveyed for Joseph Chambers, and Walter Dun, asees. 232 acres of land on part of two Military Warrants, to-wit: Chambers 112 acres on No. 2365 and Dun 120 acres on No. 5139, on the waters of Darby's Creek. Beginning at a Bur Oak and Jack Oak, Easterly corner to Dun and Johnson's Survey No. 7243; thence with their line West 127 poles to Stake in said line, Northeast corner to Joseph Chamber's Survey No. 7398 of 96 acres; thence with Chamber's line S. 10 W. 128 poles, crossing a branch to two Bur Oaks from one root, the Southeast-erly corner to Chamber's said Survey; thence West 29 poles to a Stake in a Prairie, another of Chamber's corners in the line of John Graham's Survey No. 7389; thence South 21 poles to a Stake near two Bur Oaks, Southeasterly corner to Graham's said Survey; thence with another of his lines, S. 80 W. $120\frac{1}{2}$ poles to a Stake in said line half a pole from Graham's Southwest corner; thence North 61 poles, crossing a branch to a Stake in the North line of Graham's said Survey, half a pole from his Northwest corner; thence N. 85 E. 30 poles to a Stake in said line, Southwest corner to Chamber's said Survey; thence North 114 poles to a Stake in the South line of Gabriel Peterson's Survey No. 4637, Northwest corner to Chamber's said Survey; thence with Peterson's line, N. 81 W. 123 poles to a Stake in said line, Northeasterly corner to Walter Dun's Survey No. 8470; thence with Dun's line and the line of James Johnston's Survey No. 7395, South 94 poles to a Jack Oak and forked Bur Oak, Johnston's corner in the North line of Robert Mean's Survey No. 5097; thence East 90 poles to two Black Oaks, Northeast corner to Mean's said Survey; thence with Mean's East line, South 110 poles, crossing a branch to three small Black Oaks, Northwest corner to James Galloway's Survey No. 7067; thence East 70 poles to three Black Oaks and a Hickory, another corner to Galloway's said Survey; thence South 48 poles to two Bur Oaks and an Elm, another corner of Galloway's corners; thence East 45 poles to two Bur Oaks another corner to Galloway; thence South 30 poles crossing a branch to two Bur Oaks from one root, a corner to Galloway; thence S. 20 W. 60 poles to a Stake, Southeasterly corner to Galloway's said Survey; thence West 62 poles to a Stake, Southwesterly corner to Galloway's said Survey, in the line of John Moore's Survey No. 6508; thence with Moore's line, S. 20 E. 64 poles to two White Oaks, Moore's Easterly corner; thence S. 85 E. 20 poles to a Stake in the line of John Graham's Survey No. 7832; thence with said line N. 24 E. 192 poles crossing a branch to a Stake, Graham's Northwest corner, in the line of Chamber's Survey No. 7398 of 69 acres; thence with said line N. 39 W. 14 poles to a White Thorn, a corner to Chamber's said 69 acre Survey; thence N. 10 E. 45 poles to a Stake, Northwest corner to said 69 acre Survey; thence East 127 poles to a Stake, Northeast corner to Chamber's said 69 acre Survey in the line of James Johnson's Survey No. 7823; thence with said line N. 10 E. 142 poles crossing a branch at 54 poles to the beginning.
