



Surveyed for George Clark and Walter Dun, asees, 275 acres of land on two Military Warrants, Clark 250 acres on No. 5513 and Dun 25 acres on No. 708, on the waters of Gladly run of Deer Creek. Beginning at a forked Bur Oak, Southwesterly corner to Graham and Scrugg's Survey No. 7828 and Northwesterly corner to Walter Dun and others Survey No. 8524; thence with said line S. 19 E. 82 poles, crossing a branch at 43 poles to a Hickory and Bur Oak, Westerly corner thereof; thence S. 67 W. 54 poles to two Hickories and a Bur Oak in the line of Galloway and Moody's Survey No. 6647; thence with said line N. 18 W. 78 poles, crossing a branch at 21 poles to a Hickory and Bur Oak, Northerly corner to said Survey; thence with another of their lines S. 72 W. 102 poles to a Bur Oak and White Oak in said line; thence N. 25° 30' W. 101 poles to four Bur Oaks from one root, Easterly corner to Walter Dun's Survey No. 9389; thence with his line N. 31° 30' W. 48 poles to four Bur Oaks in the edge of a prairie, corner to said Survey; thence N. 38 E. 54 poles to a Bur Oak on the edge of a prairie; thence N. 39 E. 74 poles to a Bur Oak on the edge of a prairie; thence North 100 poles crossing a branch at 57 poles to a White Oak on the edge of a prairie; thence N. 50 E. 80 poles to a large Bur Oak, Northwesterly corner to Graham and Scrugg's said Survey; thence with their line S. 11° 30' E. 336 poles, crossing a branch to the beginning.

Beginning at two Hickories, Southeast corner to James Galloway's Survey No. 6488, and corner to John Edward's Survey No. 9029; thence with Edward's line N. 39 E. 370 poles to three Bur Oaks, corner to George Galloway's Entry No. 7060; thence with his line East 40 poles to a small White Oak, Northwest corner to Cadwallader Wallace's Survey No. 8829; thence with his line S. 20 E. 302 poles to two Hickories and a White Oak in the line of George Mathew's Survey No. 5706, four poles West of his Northeast corner; thence with said line West 417 poles to the beginning.
